

# NCGC November General Meeting

## November 10, 2016

**\*\*President:** Cheryl Fawvor called the meeting to order at 10:02. After thanking everyone for coming, she turned the mic over to Mary Lou Proctor. Mary Lou introduced Dr. Diane Russell, President of the Coastal Prairie Chapter of the Texas Master Naturalists. Dr. Russell spoke on prairies and the need to preserve them. After her presentation, Cheryl called the business meeting to order.

In other words, when we changed treasurers, we would have to open a new account. Therefore, it was decided to not accept credit cards at this time.
