


*Caladium Bulbs

The fundraising project for 2016-17 is to sell caladium bulbs. We will sell #1 fancy leaf bulbs (bulbs are 1.5—2.5 " in size). Some characteristics of fancy leaf caladiums include: leaves tend to be heart shaped, taller, and have a more upright habit.

The bulbs we will be selling are Red Flash, White Christmas, and Carolyn Wharton. Each of these bulbs performed successfully in the Houston Caladium Bulb Trials of 2013 at Bear Creek and Pasadena.

Caladium bulbs will be sold in bundles of 10 bulbs (one color) for \$10, 25 bulbs (one color) for \$25 or a











Gardening Tip: Mycorrhizal Fungi



As a new gardener, a friend introduced me to Mycorrhizal Fungi. She sprinkles Mycorrhizal Fungi into the hole before planting. Mycorrhizal Fungi expands the root system of plants allowing the plant to reach nutrients and water that might not be available otherwise. Mycorrhizal Fungi extends the plant's reach, allowing it to get to more of what it needs to survive. That makes the plant stronger, especially during drought periods.

Recently, I attended a session at Enchanted Forrest on Fall Planting. I was surprised to hear the presenter say that she uses Mycorrhizal Fungi the same way I do—a small amount in the hole (ground or pot) just before putting in the plant.
